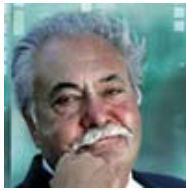

About Us

The Pistorio Foundation is dedicated to improving the living conditions of less privileged children in developing countries, with a focus on education and primary health care. In addition to providing long-term scholarships and primary health care to extremely poor children, the Foundation builds and improves school infrastructures where needed.

To date we support the long-term education of 1078 students from primary to professional school, for a total of 1363 children including pre-school and kindergarten age children across the four regions - Burkina Faso, Tibet (China), Thailand, and Cambodia. This is significant increase from 2008 in which we supported the long-term education and primary health care of 868 students, 500 in 2007, and 283 in 2006, our first operational year.

The Foundation operates through a network of volunteers in close partnership with selected NGOs.

We currently operate with no overhead costs: 100% of all donations and resources go directly to projects on location to benefit the children we support.

The Pistorio Foundation reaches out to Haiti

Due to the desperate need for aid, the Pistorio Foundation donated a total of **US\$30 000** for the victims of the earthquake. \$10 000 was given to Medecins sans Frontière (to assist immediately for urgent medical needs), \$10 000 to Lumiere pour Haiti (a small organization that focuses on education for children) and \$10 000 to Entrepreneurs du Monde (in order to contribute to the reconstruction effort).

Ban Mhai Pattaná LIBRARY ROOM

Two new projects for a library and computer room at the Pistorio Foundation's Primary School in Ban Mhai Pattana, Chiang Rai were successfully completed.



Library Room

The project offers disadvantaged Hill Tribe children enhanced learning opportunities by providing over 500 bilingual books (Thai and English) and a reading room for the pupils (171 in total), as well as for their families and the community of Ban Mhai Pattana and the neighboring villages. The library will thus aid the acquisition of knowledge and language skills not only amongst the pupils, but also within the community at large, thereby encouraging a more active involvement in the children's learning.



Computer Room

The project provides the pupils with access to a fully-equipped computer room (including 10 computers, Internet connection, headsets and microphones, chairs, blinds and carpeting). The creation of the computer room offers students the opportunity to gain essential computer skills. Furthermore, it allows both the pupils and teachers to discover knowledge of the outside world and in turn to expand opportunities for their futures.

After hearing about the plight of underprivileged children at a school presentation hosted in October 2009 by the Pistorio Foundation, 4th graders Bryce Pampell and Cindy Lee of the Canadian International School took it upon themselves to raise funds for this cause. They baked cupcakes and, together, approached fellow residents at their condo selling their baked goods. They managed to raise almost half of the \$300 needed to fund a child in Thailand for an entire year of schooling. The Foundation matched the amount raised by them and the result is that another child in Thailand now has the opportunity to go to school. The Foundation was very moved by the initiative of these two children who have received certificates acknowledging their generosity.



Garage Sale

At the Canadian International School's 'garage' sale in May 2009, a group of 8 and 9 year-olds got together to sell unused toys, books, games, Lego, videos, etc., with the aim of donating 30% of the proceeds to Pistorio Foundation. By the end of a busy day, they had raised more than \$110 dollars for the Foundation. Parents pitched in the remaining \$190 to provide funding for one child to attend school for a year in Thailand.
