Pasquale Pistorio Inaugurates Secondary School of Sogpelcé, Burkina Faso, February 2009



On February 19 the inauguration of the Secondary School in Sogpelcé was attended by Pasquale Pistorio and Piero Martinotti as well as Valeria Dragone from CIAI. The school, which consists of four buildings, opened in October 2008 with 76 students.

Due to lack of infrastructure, Burkina Faso has a very low secondary school enrolment rate (according to UNESCO, only 52% of pupils continue to secondary school). The project was born to allow the elementary children we support in the Nibagdo region to continue their schooling through to secondary school. The children of seven neighbouring villages can finally look forward to attending a secondary school.

The Pistorio Foundation's first infrastructure project in 2006 was the Nibagdo primary school where it continues to support the scholarships of 50 children. The Foundation supports the education and primary health care of a total of 100 children from six different villages.

The Pistorio Foundation held the inauguration of the Ban Mhai Pattaná primary school on February 9 in the presence of Pasquale Pistorio, H.E. Italian Ambassador to Thailand Ignazio di Pace, local Partner representative Gianni dalla Rizza, and Elena Pistorio, among other Foundation volunteers and journalists including Mr. Massimo Morello and photographer Andrea Pistolesi.

Ninety-one children are currently attending the school. The parents of the hill tribe children mentioned, "a school close to our village has always been our dream, the future will be brighter for our children, unlike us they will learn to read and write." Previously, children spent the school area in remote towns to be able to attend school, as one parent claimed, "for our children to go to school and be with the family in the evenings is the biggest gift we could have ever asked for."

The construction of a school and dormitory in Hmong village has also been completed and the school opened in May 2009 with 100 pupils, and will hold up to 200 children in full capacity. The school caters to three different hill-tribe villages.

Global Crisis hits the poorest of the poor in Cambodia especially hard: Pistorio Foundation increases support to new flood of destitute children



The current economic crisis has had devastating consequences on the garbage scavengers of the municipal dump of Stung Mean Chey. Families that were previously living on an average of \$2 per day are now only making a quarter of that. Combined with rising unemployment rates there is a now a new flood of poor children on the streets whose families are on the brink of starvation. The Foundation has decided to support the long-term education and health

care of 50 more children at the PSE (Pour un Sourire d'Enfant) center which rescues and provides an education to children working at the dump and to street children. The Foundation supports a total of 183 children at the PSE center.
